New Sections added include; 032 - Agency Contact Information – Public Records Officer; 033 - Availability of Public Records; 034 - Processing of Public Records Requests – General; 036 - Exemptions; 037 - Costs of Providing Copies of Public Records; 038 - Review of Denials of Public Records.

records. The subject of the original WAC 162-04-035 is no longer relevant, as the process does not conform to						
current records release exemptions.						
Reasons supporting proposal: The original rules are out of date. The proposed rules reflect the language in the Public						
Records Act Model Rules WAC 44-14. There is also no mechanism within the original rules for charging for copies of public records requests. As a small agency with limited resources and a large volume of public records requests, the Human Rights						
Commission is struggling with covering those costs and dealing with voluminous requests. The proposed rules will allow the						
agency to charge the statutory default costs for copying and mailing records.
